

- **8.** The Latin name for the two tube-shaped organs that carry urine from the kidneys to the vesica urinaria.
- **9.** The Latin name for the largest lymph vessel in the body.
- **12.** The Latin name for the single bone formed by the fusion of the bodies of three bones in the pelvic girdle under natural conditions.
- **13.** The group of animals where the apex of the lobus cranialis dexter in the lungs is rounded, while the apex of the lobus cranialis sinister is pointed.
- **14.** The name of the anatomical structure in the female pelvis that is wider compared to the male pelvis.

- 1. The Latin name for the group of animals with a heart-shaped right kidney and a bean-shaped left kidney.
- 2. The name for the type of joint where the bones of the thoracic limb are connected through strong shoulder muscles.
- **3.** The name of the light pink glandular organ located caudal to the stomach and liver, ventral to the vertebral column, and dorsal to the duodenum.
- 4. The Latin name of an organ in the circulatory system located in the regio hypochondriaca sinistra, which stores blood and releases it into circulation when needed. - **5.** The Latin name for the cavity located between the diaphragm and the pelvic inlet (Linea terminalis)

- 10. The name of the structure that starts from the last ring of the larynx, the cartilago cricoidea. The starting part is above the planum medianum. As it progresses distally, it deviates to the right and passes to the right of the planum medianum before entering the apertura thoracica cranialis.
